Housing Bills Back on Legislative Agenda

The California State Legislature has 7 proposed housing bills which the Torrance City Council opposed through a resolution on January 26. The resolution states in part the following:

- The council is opposed to the multitudes of bills being proposed that directly impact and interfere with the ability of Cities to control their own destiny through use of the zoning authority that has been granted to them.
- Should the State continue to pass legislation that attacks local municipal authority, control and revenue, the City of Torrance will support actions such as a ballot measure that would limit the State ability to control local activities and strengthen local democracy and authority.

One of the bills, SB 9, allows 6 units without public input where 1 single-family home now stands. It ends single-family zoning statewide, overriding city powers.

Torrance School Board Observer Report

At the February 1, 2021 meeting, the school board discussed the following items:

Return to School: In-person instruction resumed for Blended Learning TK, K, and 1st Grade students, and for athletic training. It was also announced that Blended Learning 2^{nd} Grade students would return to campus on February 11. The Board is awaiting word from the State regarding when $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ Grade students will return to in-person instruction.

Dual Immersion Kindergarten Program: The Board announced the launch of the District's first-ever Dual Immersion Program, being taught in Spanish. The program will be offered to incoming (2021-2022) kindergarten students at Carr and Torrance Elementary Schools.

Vaccine: TUSD staff is working closely with the City of Torrance to help facilitate vaccine distribution to TUSD employees when they become available, hopefully sometime in February.

Covid-19 Cases: TUSD provides information regarding COVID-19 cases among District students and staff (in-person instruction and on campus only) while also maintaining privacy and confidentiality for students and staff. Torrance Refinery Update

It has been 6 years since the explosion on February 18, 2015, which nearly released 50,000 lb of MHF (Modified Hydrofluoric Acid – a highly toxic chemical that, if released, forms a ground hugging cloud that can drift for miles). Only two refineries in California still use large quantities of MHF – our own Torrance Refinery and the Valero Wilmington Refinery.

After the explosion, the AQMD investigated the use of MHF. After many hearings attended by crowds from both sides of the issue, the AQMD decided in September 2019 to allow the refineries to make voluntary enhanced safety measures. A report from December 2020 states that the proposed enhancements at the Torrance Refinery are on schedule for implementation in 2021.

Of course, no amount of safety measures can be 100% effective. The Torrance Refinery Action Alliance (TRAA) has been advocating for the refineries to convert to a much safer process such as is used at Chevron in El Segundo. Metro Green Line Extension to Torrance

By 2028, the Metro Green Line will be extended from the existing Redondo Beach Station on Marine Ave. just west of the 405 to the proposed Regional Transit Center in Torrance (on Crenshaw between Torrance Blvd. and 190th).

The 3¹/₂ year analysis recently begun will study two potential routes through Lawndale to the Metro railroad right-ofway near 190th and Hawthorne in Torrance.



From there, the existing railroad right-of-way will be used to the Torrance Regional Transit Center.

Throughout this analysis period there will be opportunities for the public to comment on the project and participate in community meetings and events. There have already been 2 virtual scoping meetings in February.
