Parks & Rec Report

At the direction of the Torrance City Council, the Parks & Recreation Commission was tasked with finding a park in our city that could accommodate a possible off-leash dog park for its citizens. Two safe and secure enclosures would be necessary, one for small dogs and another for larger pets.

After surveying many of our parks, Columbia Park has been selected for further review and consideration. With a number of restrictions and required maintenance reviews, a recommendation will be presented if it is decided that Columbia Park would be a suitable site. City Council would then review the project and give final approval.

New Laws for 2024

Each new year brings with it new laws for Californians. Here is a list of some of these new laws:

- SB 700 Prohibits an employer from requesting information about an applicant's prior cannabis use.
- AB 1228 –Raises the minimum wage of fast-food workers to \$20/hour in April (national fast-food chains with more than 60 establishments).
- SB 525 Increase the minimum wage of some health care workers in June and will eventually reach \$25 for all health care workers by 2033.
- SB 616 Requires employers to allow a minimum of 5 paid sick days a year for hourly and salary workers.
- AB 28 Imposes an 11% tax on firearms and ammunition to help fund violence prevention programs.
- AB 360 Establishes the "Ebony Alert" for missing young Black women and children.
- AB 452 Eliminates the statute of limitations for victims of childhood sexual assault that occurs on or after January 1.
- AB 12 Starting in July, landlords may not charge more than one month's rent for a security deposit.
- SB 4 Allows places of worship or independent higher education institutions to build a housing development on their property "by right."
- AB 1084 Requires retailers to have a gender-neutral toy section.
- SB 478 Requires websites to show the actual cost of a service or item upfront starting in July (i.e. hotel stays, event tickets, food delivery).

TPD's E-Bike Safety Program

At the January 9 City Council meeting, Torrance
Police Department's Lieutenant Chad Farley presented TPD's New
E-Bike Safety Program. The police will be focusing on the following public awareness measures:

- The inherent hazards of riding on the street
- Applicable vehicle and municipal codes
- Habits that will keep you and your property safe
- Promotion through schools and social media

While there is definitely concern in the community over the speed and increase in the number of e-bikes, there has been no significant increase in the number of traffic collisions involving e-bikes in Torrance. As noted by Lieutenant Farley, this is in contrast to neighboring cities

It is important for parents to understand they are liable and can be charged for any damage or injuries caused by their child on an e-bike. Children need to be especially careful when they ride on the sidewalk to watch for cars backing out and they should yield to pedestrians. Common violations are two people on an e-bike, not honoring stop signs, and speeding.

Please be sure your kids know the rules and be safe out there!
